


Cherokee Nation

Cherokee Nation Pedestrian Safety


- January 1, 2017-January 1,2022

 - \$500,000







- Walkability and observational assessments
 - No speed limit signs

 - No School Zone signs
 - No crosswalks
- Speed Radar checks
 - Conducted during the morning
 - Average Speeds- 26.4 mph
 - Top Speed- 40 mph
 - 26 pedestrians crossing





